## **Philosophy**

Regardless of when students declared, majors in the classes of '20, '21, and '22 may satisfy either the new major requirements, or the old, or a hybrid. In practice, what this means is that students in these classes are required to take a total of 11.5 units for the major; and up to 1.5 of these may be intensives. Thus, the final, elective 1.5 units could consist of: (i) 1.5 credits worth of intensives (the new requirements); or (ii) two, regular non-intensive classes (the old requirements); or (iii) one credit of regular class plus 0.5 units of intensive (a hybrid option).

Members of the class of 2023 and beyond will only have option (i).
